

COMMODORE'S REPORT

As of this early date, February 17th (which is the Tell Tale deadline) the club has received replies from approximately 30 percent of the members with respect to approval of the reconstruction financing. The response so far indicates an overwhelming approval for the Board to proceed as requested.

In the event the majority of members do give their approval, it is conceivable that the reconstruction work could commence by the beginning of April. Paul Brent's committee will keep the membership informed of all progress.

We expect to have completed redecoration of the main bar by the time you receive this, including construction of a firewood box, dry cleaning of all the burgees and some rearrangement of the pictures. Most of this work will be done in-house with the balance coming from the M & I Account (which was established for such purposes). As part of our on-going improvement program we hope to install new carpeting in the main bar to match the dining room; refinish the dining room walls and tackle the upstairs bar with a slightly better canopy over the bar itself and refinish the walls for the proposed new gallery of present member's yachts.

Russ Schneider, Director, 35-year member of C.Y.C., and one of the top Bay racers (with so many season championships to his name it is almost embarrassing) recently underwent open heart surgery and is recuperating nicely. We all wish him a speedy recovery.


